

A11 Spooner Row to Tuttle Interchange Reconstruction Scheme

National Highways is progressing plans for a concrete reconstruction scheme on the A11 between Spooner Row and the Tuttle Interchange.

A reconstruction scheme involves removing the road surface and some of the foundations, before rebuilding the road with alternative material. As well as reconstructing the carriageway, the work will include replacing safety barriers, repainting road markings and inserting new reflective road studs (cat's eyes).
